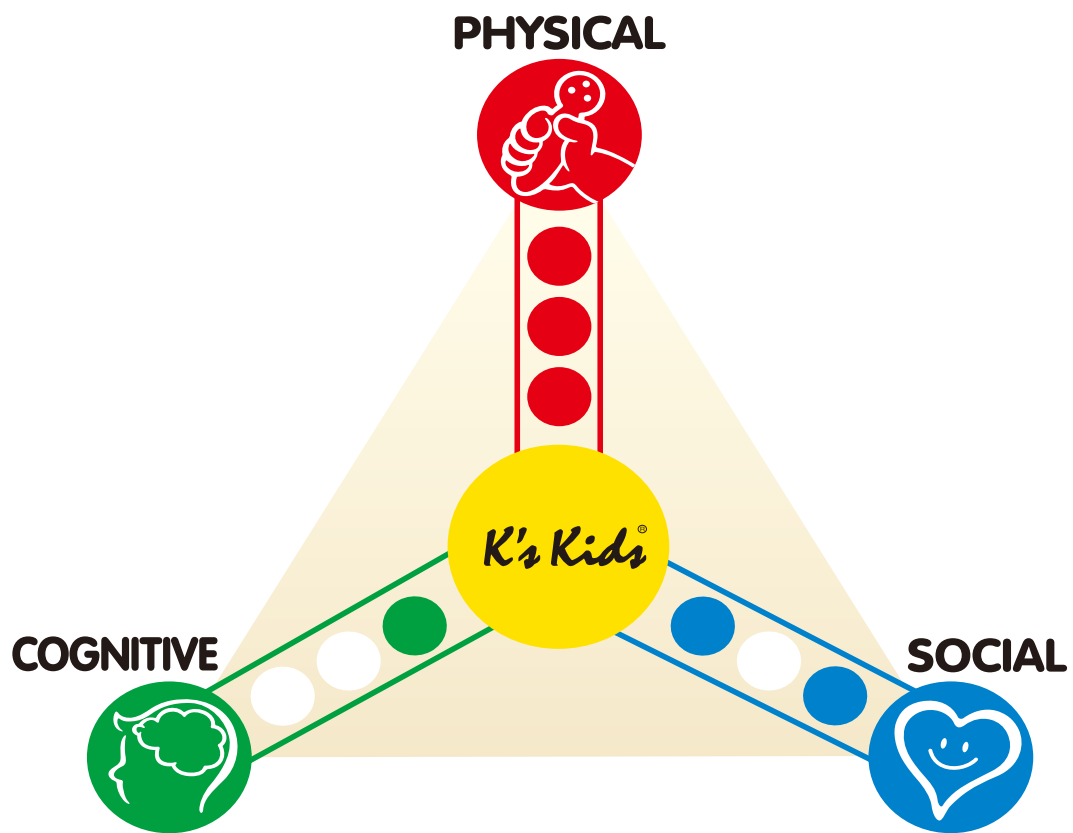

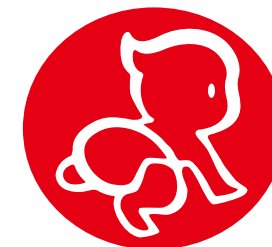
K's Kids Learning Triangle®

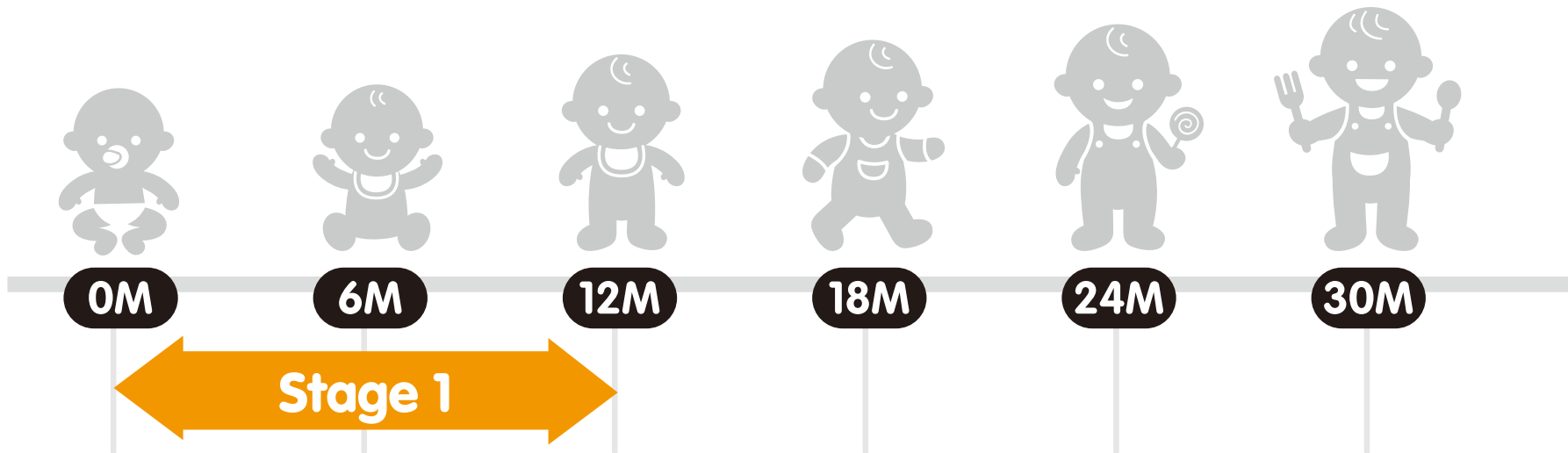


These are recommendations made under normal circumstances. Parents can determine which activities are most suitable depending on the progress of individual child.

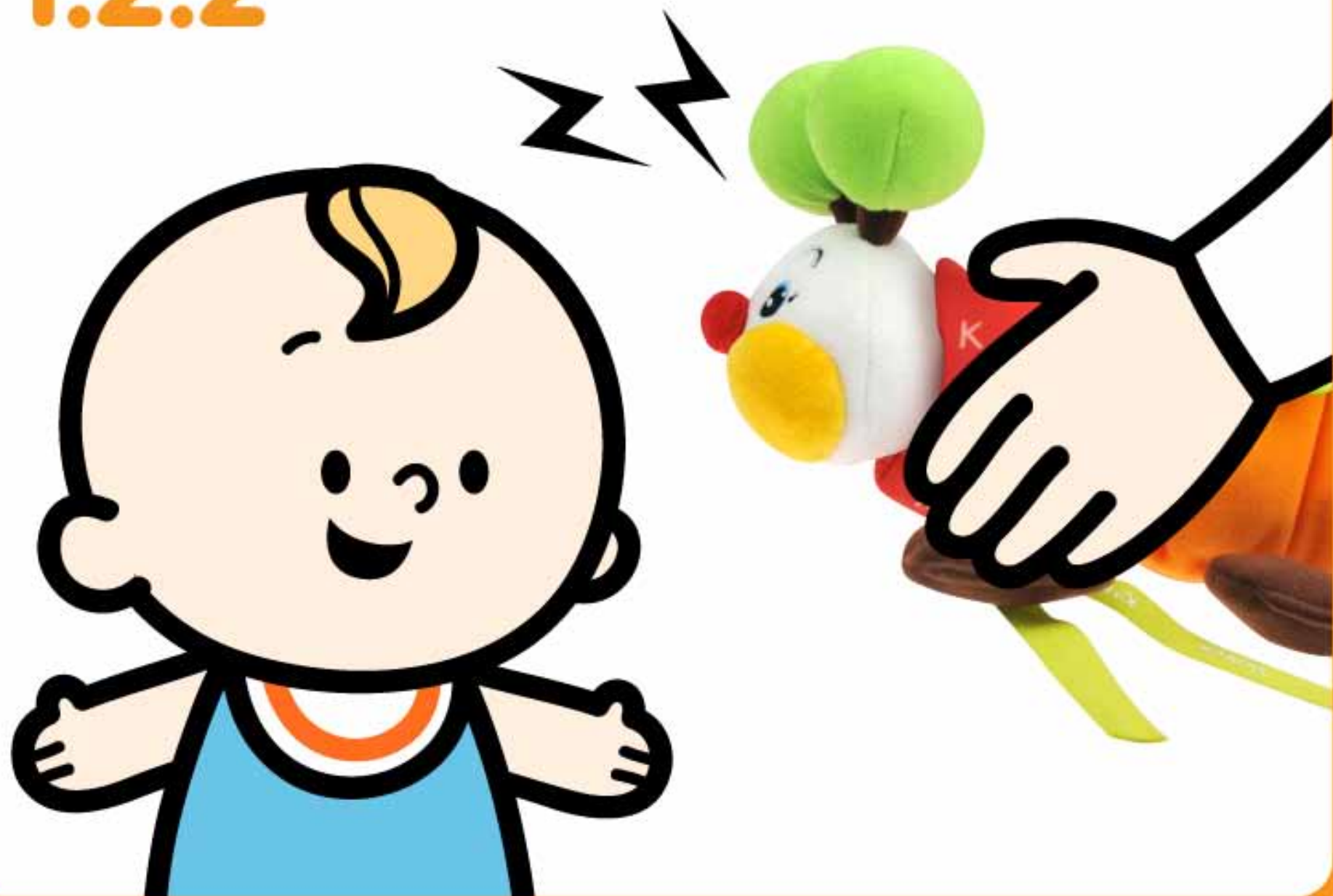

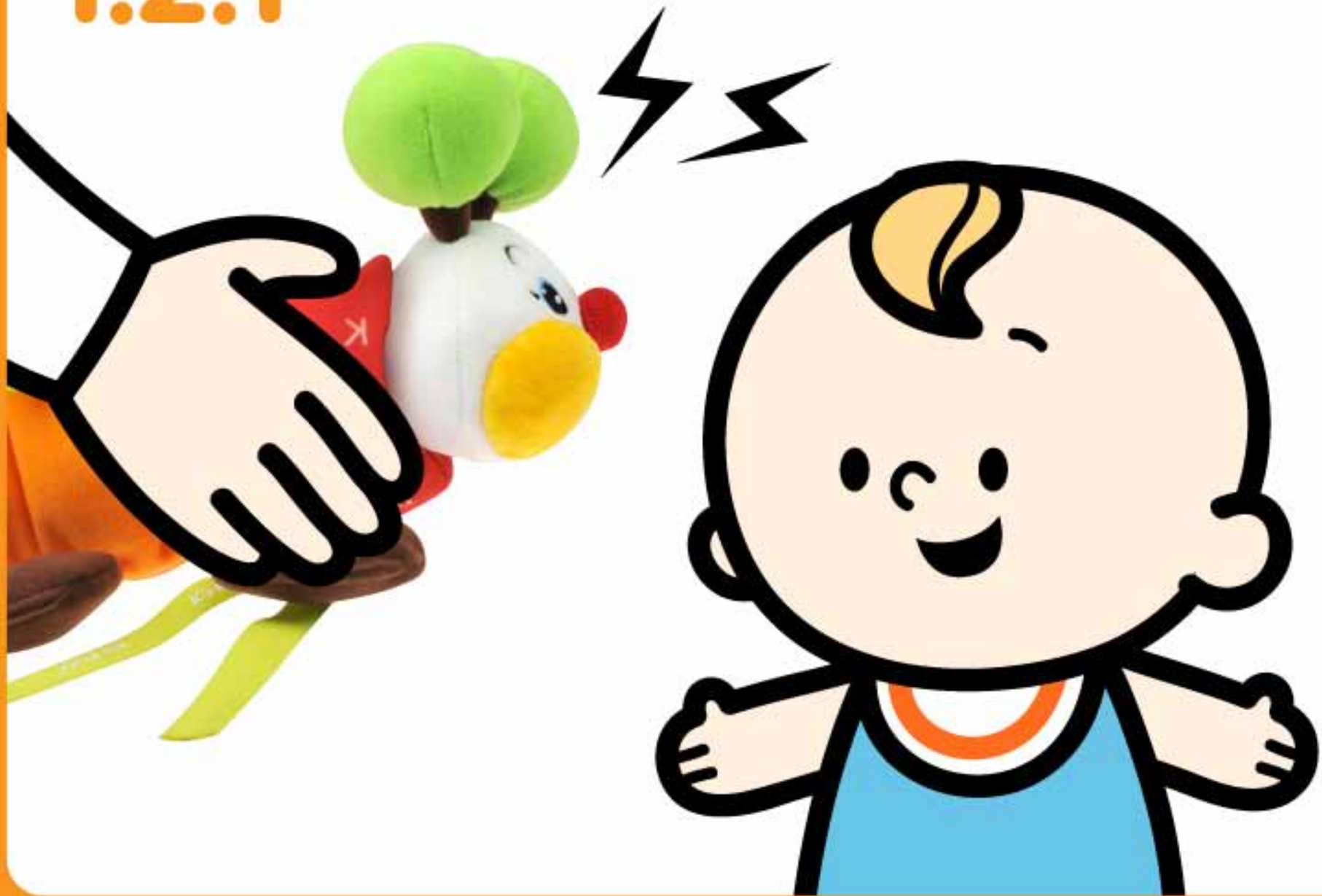
Objective: Listening training

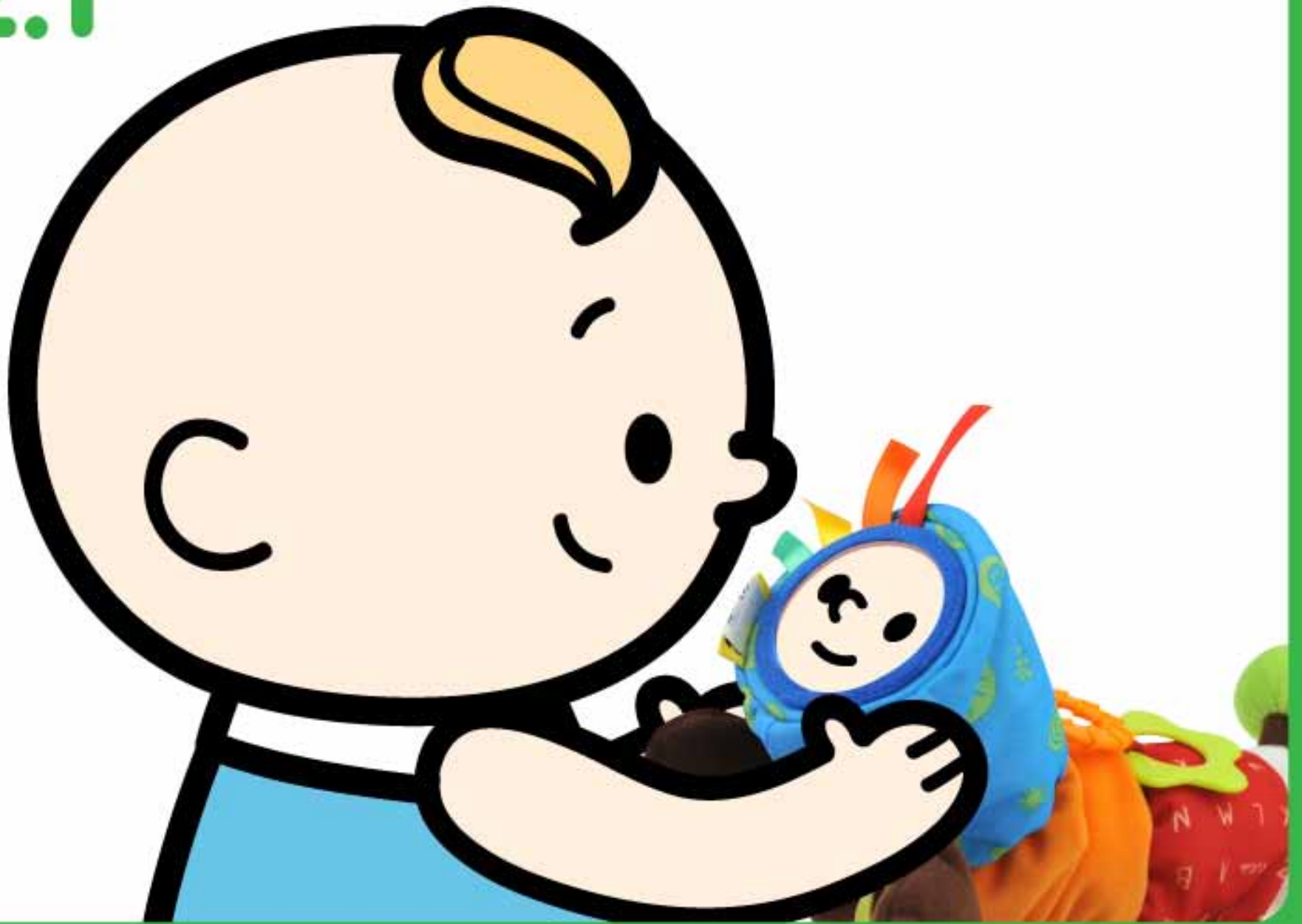
Activity 2.1

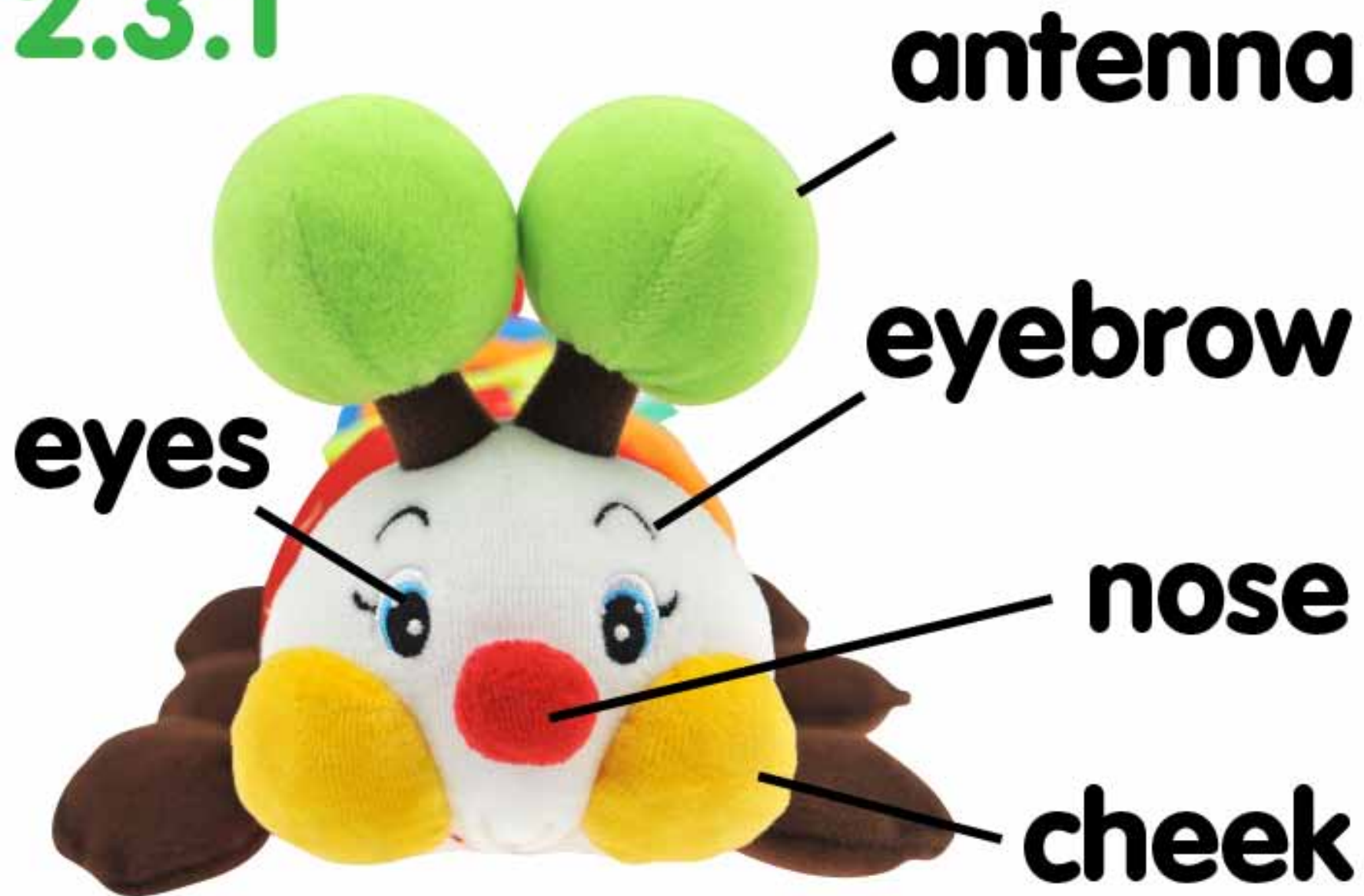

Objective: Recognizing body parts and facial features

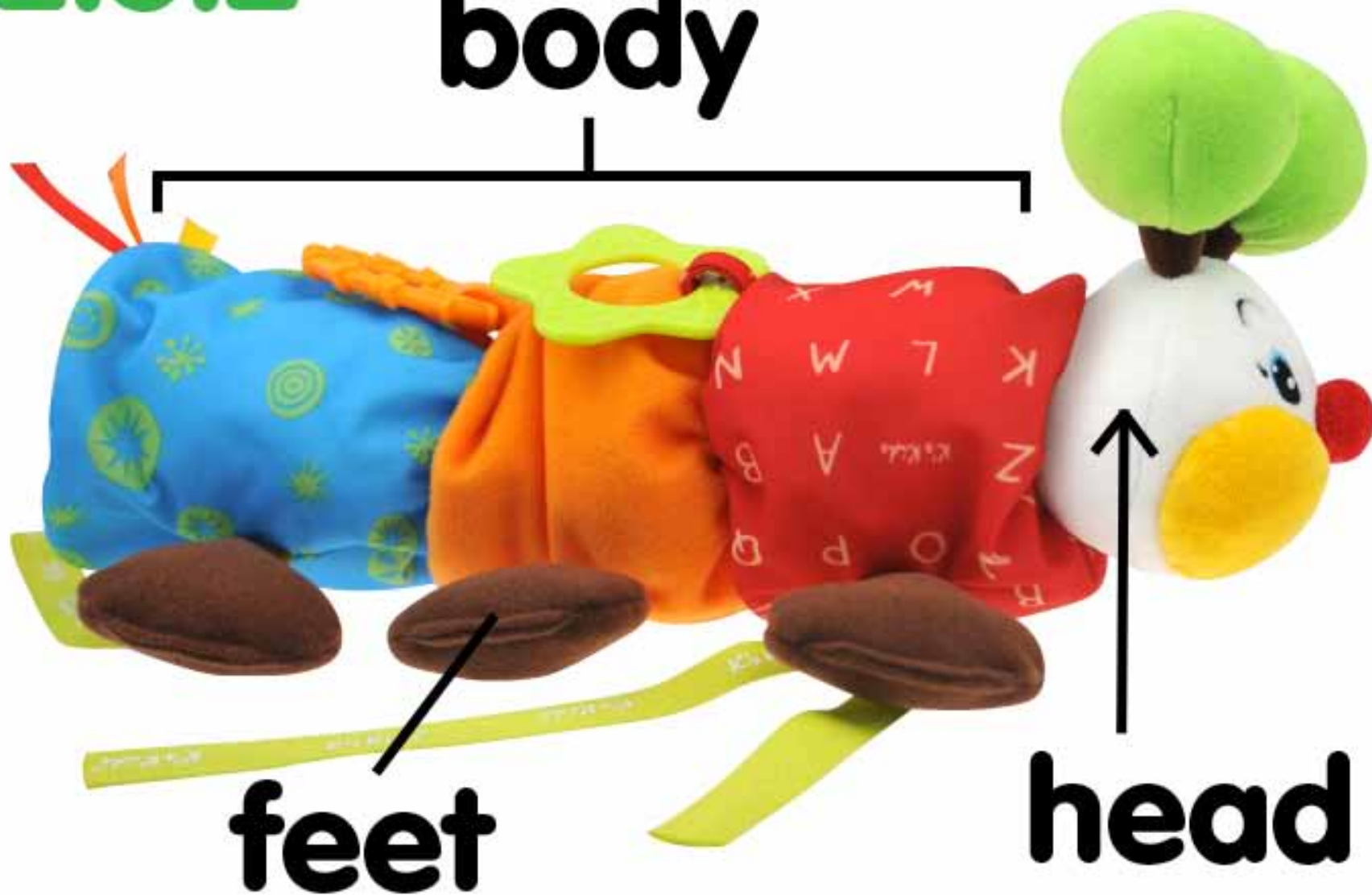
Method: Use the inchworm to teach children to recognize body parts and facial features.

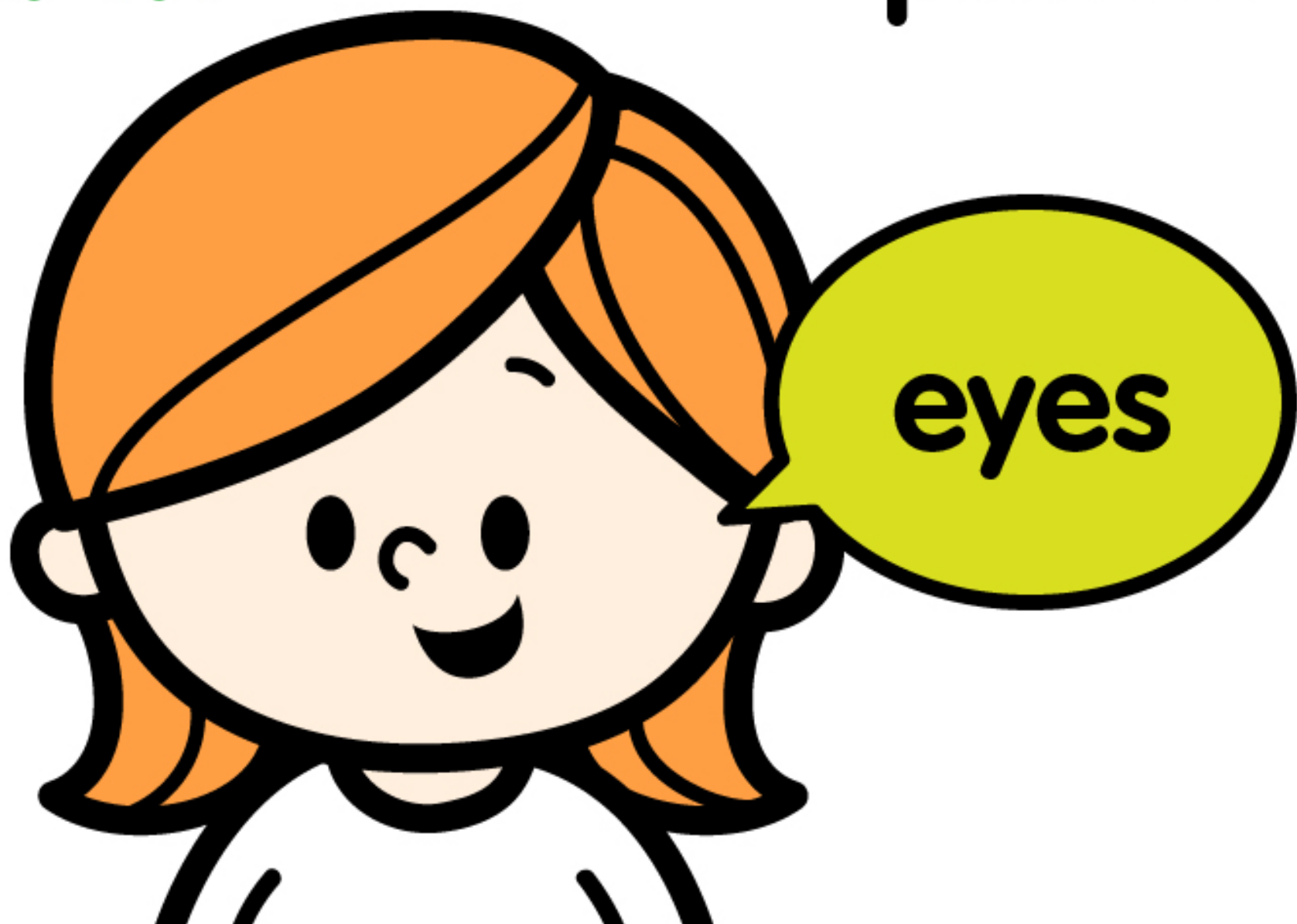


Objective: Pointing out body parts and facial features

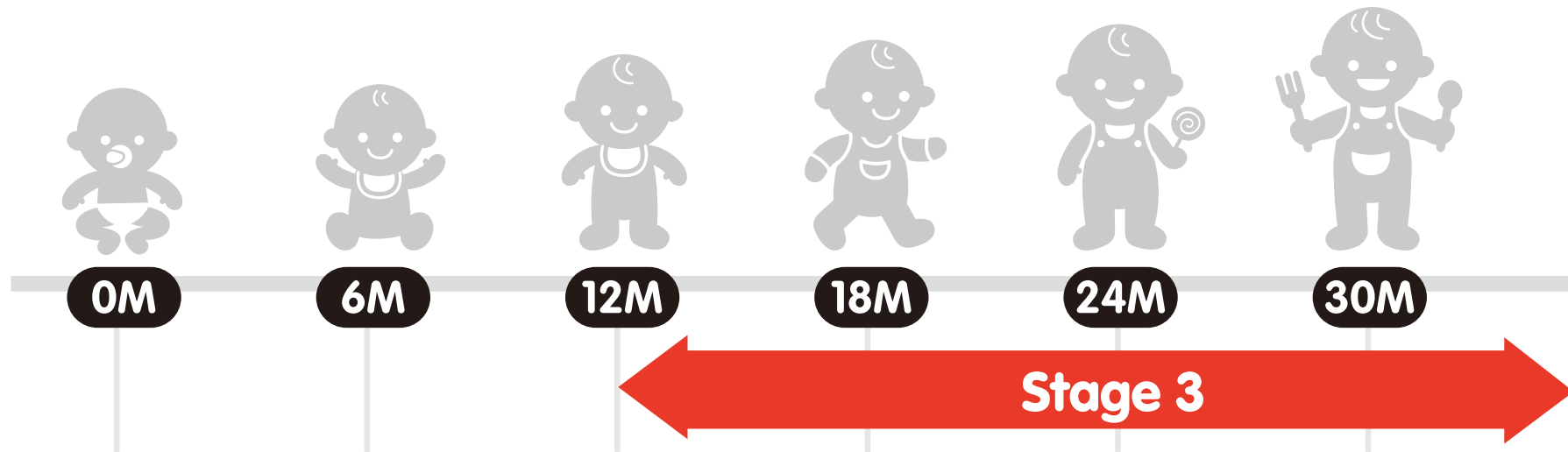
