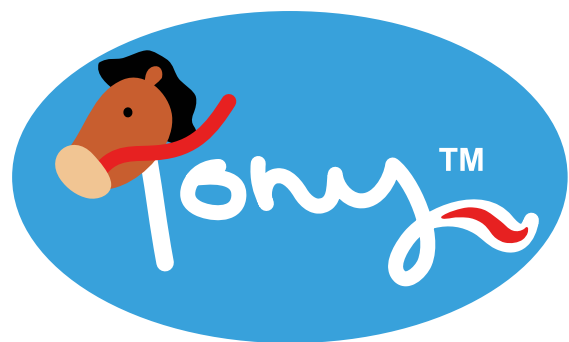

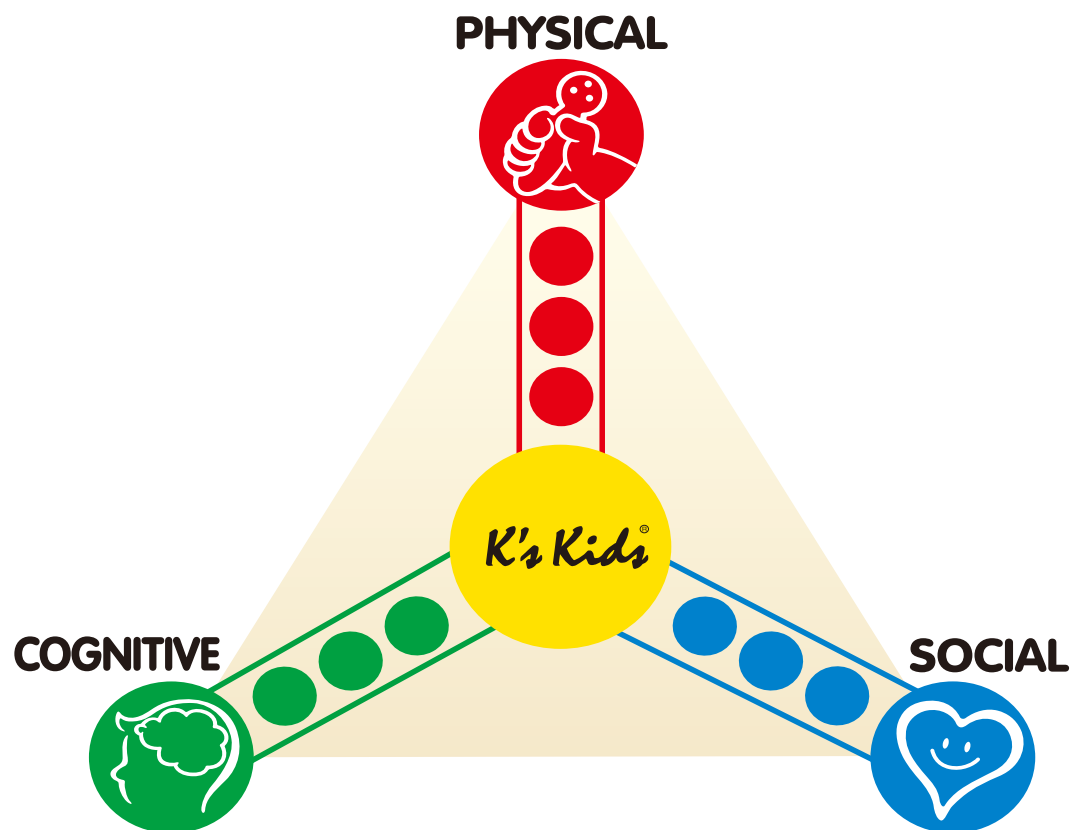

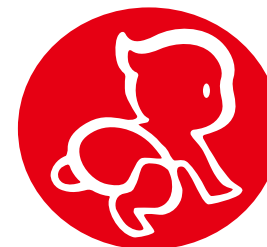
K's Kids Learning Triangle®

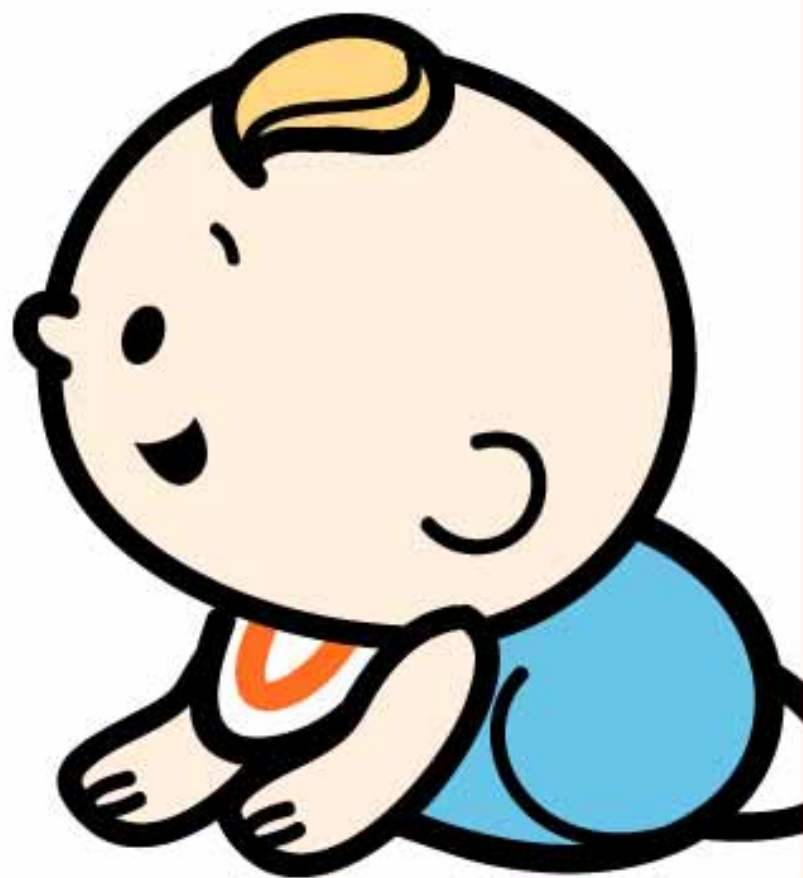
Activity 1.2

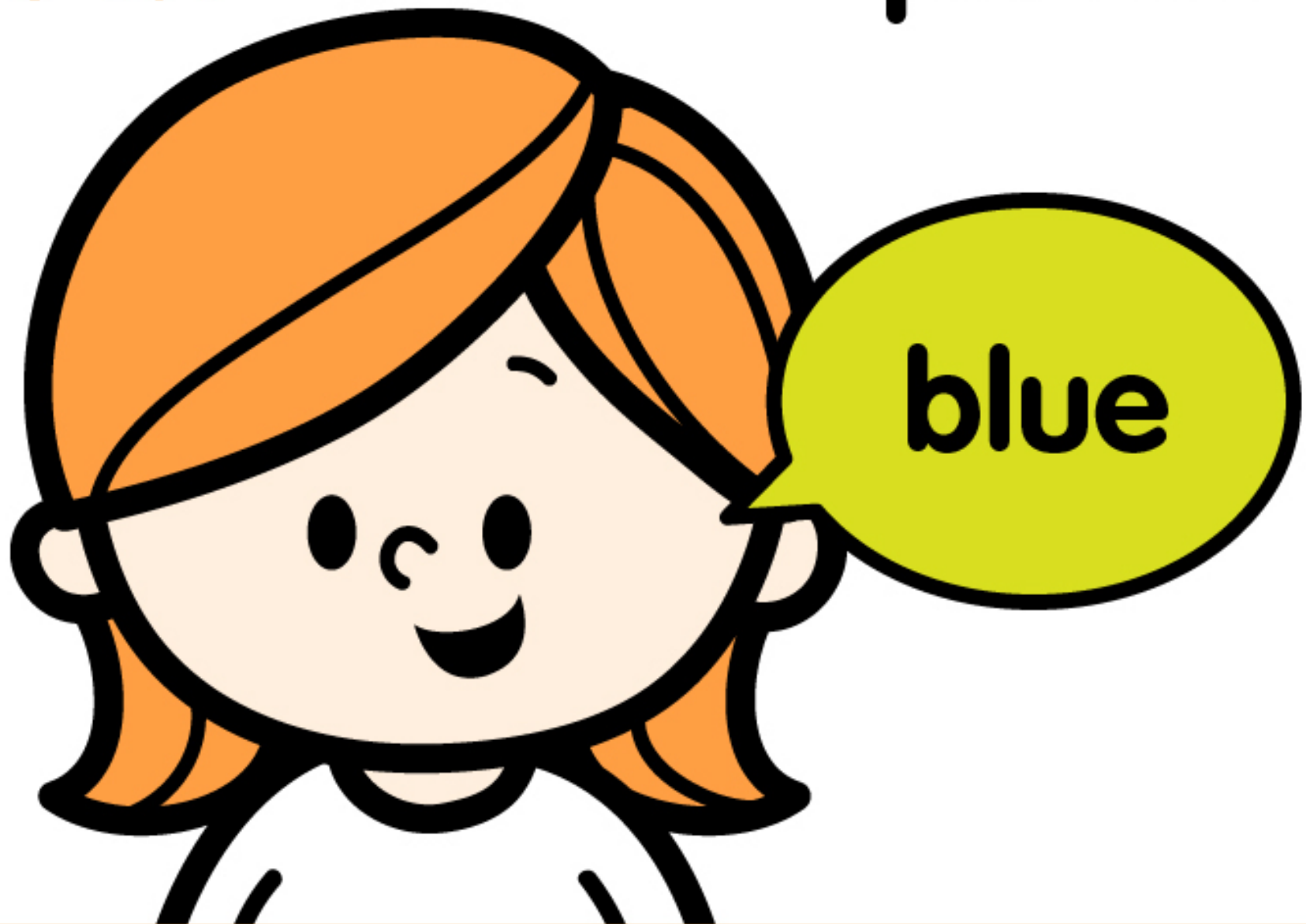


Objective: Pointing out colors
